12	AND EACH CHARTER SCHOOL EMPLOY A MINIMUM OF ONE FULL-TIME
13	SCHOOL NURSE; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS; PROVIDING RULEMAKING
14	AUTHORITY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of the Public School Code is
18	enacted to read:
19	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] MANDATORY SCHOOL NURSEWAIVERRULEMAKING
20	AUTHORITY
21	A. Each public school shall employ a minimum of one
22	full-time school nurse each school year, unless the department
23	has granted the public school a waiver pursuant to Subsection B
24	of this section.
25	B. The department may grant a waiver to a rural

As used in this section: "public school" includes a charter school; (1)15 and 16 "school nurse" means a person who: 17 (2) (a) is a nurse authorized pursuant to 18 19 the Nursing Practice Act to practice as a professional 20 registered nurse; is licensed by the department and (b) 21 the board of nursing as a school nurse; and 22 (c) provides services as a school nurse 23 at a school." 24 Section 22-8-6.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993, 25 SECTION 2. .218393.2 - 2 -

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Chapter 227, Section 8, as amended by Laws 2019, Chapter 206, Section 9 and by Laws 2019, Chapter 207, Section 9) is amended to read:

"22-8-6.1. CHARTER SCHOOL OPERATING BUDGETS--MAXIMUM MEM.--

A. Each state-chartered charter school shall submit
to the charter schools division of the department a schoolbased operating budget. The operating budget shall be
submitted to the division for approval or amendment pursuant to
the Public School Finance Act and the Charter Schools Act.
Thereafter, the operating budget shall be submitted to the
commission for review.

B. Each locally chartered charter school shall submit to the local school board a school-based operating budget for approval or amendment. The approval or amendment authority of the local school board relative to the charter school operating budget is limited to ensuring that sound fiscal practices are followed in the development of the operating budget and that the charter school operating budget is within the allotted resources. The local school board shall have no veto authority over individual line items within the charter school's proposed financial budget or over any item in the educational plan, but shall approve or disapprove the operating budget in its entirety. Upon final approval of the charter school operating budget by the local school board, the

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individual charter school operating budget shall be included separately in the budget submission to the department required pursuant to the Public School Finance Act and the Charter Schools Act.

C. For its first year of operation, a charter school's operating budget shall be based on the projected 7 number of program units generated by the school and its students using the at-risk index and the staffing cost 8 9 multiplier of the school district in which the charter school is located, and the charter school's operating budget shall be 10 adjusted using the qualified MEM on the first reporting date of 12 the current school year. For its second and subsequent fiscal years of operation, a charter school's operating budget shall be based on the number of program units generated by the charter school and its students using the average of the MEM on the second and third reporting dates of the prior year, the atrisk index of the school district in which the charter school is located and the charter school's staffing cost multiplier. 18

The department shall not approve the operating D. budget of a charter school that does not provide for a fulltime school nurse as provided for in Section 1 of this 2021 act unless a waiver has been granted as provided in Section 1 of this 2021 act.

E. As used in this section, "school nurse" means a person who:

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1	(1) is a nurse authorized pursuant to the
2	Nursing Practice Act to practice as a professional registered
3	<u>nurse;</u>
4	(2) is licensed by the department and the
5	board of nursing as a school nurse; and
6	<u>(3) provides services as a school nurse at a</u>

8	SECTION 3. Section 22-8-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967,
9	Chapter 16, Section 63, as amended by Laws 2019, Chapter 206,
10	Section 10 and by Laws 2019, Chapter 207, Section 10) is
11	amended to read:
12	"22-8-9. BUDGETSMINIMUM REQUIREMENTS
13	A. An operating budget for a school district shall
14	not be approved by the department if the educational plan does
15	not provide for:
16	(1) a school year and school day as provided
17	in Section 22-2-8.1 NMSA 1978; [and]
18	(2) a pupil-teacher ratio or class or teaching
19	load as provided in Section 22-10A-20 NMSA 1978; and
20	(3) employment of a full-time school nurse as
21	provided for in Section 1 of this 2021 act at every public
22	school in the school district unless a waiver has been granted
23	as provided in Section 1 of this 2021 act.
24	B. The department shall, by rule, establish the
25	requirements for an instructional day, the standards for an
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1	instructional hour and the standards for a full-time teacher
2	and for the equivalent thereof.
3	C. As used in this section, "school nurse" means a
4	person who:
5	(1) is a nurse authorized pursuant to the
6	Nursing Practice Act to practice as a professional registered
7	<u>nurse;</u>
8	(2) is licensed by the department and the
9	board of nursing as a school nurse; and
10	<u>(3) provides services as a school nurse at a</u>
11	<u>school.</u> "
12	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONFive million dollars
13	(\$5,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
14	public education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2022
15	to assist public schools and charter schools with hiring school
16	nurses in each public school and charter school in the state.
17	Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
18	fiscal year 2022 shall revert to the general fund.
19	SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
20	provisions of this act is July 1, 2021.
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
