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20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
21	SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 4, Section 5
22	of the constitution of New Mexico to read:
23	"[A.] Each regular session of the legislature shall
24	begin annually at 12:00 noon on the third Tuesday of [ <del>January</del> ]
25	<u>February</u> . Every regular session of the legislature [ <del>convening</del>

Every regular session of the legislature 6 7 convening during an even-numbered year shall consider only the following: 8 9 (1) budgets, appropriations and revenue bills; 10 (2) bills drawn pursuant to special messages 11 of the governor; and 12 (3) bills of the last previous regular session vetoed by the governor. ]" 13 14 SECTION 2. It is proposed to amend Article 4, Section 23 15 of the constitution of New Mexico to read: 16 "Laws shall go into effect [ninety] seventy-five days = delete 17 after the adjournment of the legislature enacting them, except 18 general appropriation laws, which shall go into effect 19 immediately upon their passage and approval. Any act necessary bracketed material] 20 for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety 21 shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, 22 provided it be passed by [two-thirds] a two-thirds' vote of 23 each house and such necessity be stated in a separate section." 24 SECTION 3. The amendment proposed by this resolution 25 shall be submitted to the people for their approval or .220226.5
