22	A. Taxpayers are liable for tax at the time of and
23	after the transaction or incident giving rise to tax until
24	payment is made. Taxes are due on and after the date on which
25	their payment is required until payment is made.

Every taxpayer shall, on or before the date on which payment of any tax is due, complete and file a tax return in a form prescribed and according to the regulations issued by the secretary. Except as provided in Section 7-1-13.1 NMSA 1978 or by regulation, ruling, order or instruction of the secretary, the payment of any tax or the filing of any return may be accomplished by mail. When the filing of a tax return or payment of a tax is accomplished by mail, the date of the postmark shall be considered the date of submission of the return or payment.

[C. If any adjustment is made in the basis for computation of any federal tax as a result of an audit by the internal revenue service or the filing of an amended federal return changing a prior election or making any other change for which federal approval is required by the Internal Revenue Code, the taxpayer affected shall, within one hundred eighty days of final determination of the adjustment, file an amended return with the department. Payment of any additional tax due shall accompany the return.

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1 of taxpayers, for no more than a total of twelve months, the 2 date on which payment of any tax is required or on which any 3 return required by provision of the Tax Administration Act 4 shall be filed, but no extension shall prevent the accrual of 5 interest as otherwise provided by law. 25	paragraph no later than ninety days after the time for the

2	tiered partnerships and their partners as established pursuant
3	to Section 6226 of the Internal Revenue Code and the
4	regulations thereunder; and
5	(2) a partner of a partnership or a tiered
6	partner subject to tax pursuant to Section 7-2-3 or 7-2A-3 NMSA
7	<u>1978 on adjustments to which Paragraph (1) of this subsection</u>
8	applies shall file a federal adjustments report reporting the
9	partner's distributive share of the adjustments and shall pay
10	the additional amount of state tax due, plus any penalty and
11	interest due and less any credit for related amounts paid or
12	withheld and remitted on behalf of the partner pursuant to
13	Paragraph (1) of this subsection as follows:
14	(a) for taxable direct partners of the

4	request. A partnership making an election pursuant to this
5	subsection shall:
6	(1) file a completed federal adjustments
7	report and notify the department that it is making the election
8	pursuant to this subsection; and
9	(2) pay an amount, determined as follows, in
10	lieu of taxes owed by its direct and indirect taxable partners:
11	(a) exclude from the total final federal
12	adjustments the distributive share reported to a direct partner
13	that is an exempt partner unless the adjustment represents
14	unrelated business taxable income;
15	(b) include only the portion of the
16	total federal adjustment to distributive shares of partners
17	taken into account pursuant to Section 6225(b)(2) of the
18	Internal Revenue Code;
19	(c) apportion and allocate the
20	adjustments as provided by the Uniform Division of Income for
21	Tax Purposes Act as applied at the partnership level following
22	any department regulations adopted for this purpose;
23	(d) multiply the resulting amount by the
24	highest tax rate provided by Section 7-2A-5 NMSA 1978; and
25	(e) add to the amount calculated
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1	pursuant to Subparagraph (d) of this paragraph an amount of
2	penalty and interest computed pursuant to the Tax
3	Administration Act.
4	H. In any action required or allowed to be taken
5	pursuant to the Tax Administration Act with respect to the
6	reporting of federal adjustments by a partnership, the state
7	partnership representative for the reviewed year shall have the
8	sole authority to act on behalf of the partnership, and the
9	partnership's direct partners and indirect partners shall be
10	bound by those actions. The state partnership representative
11	is the partnership's federal partnership representative for the
12	reviewed year, unless the partnership designates in writing
13	another person as its state partnership representative;
14	provided that the person meets any qualifications established
15	by the department.
16	I. Pursuant to procedures that may be adopted by
17	the department, an audited partnership or tiered partner of
18	that partnership may enter into an agreement with the
19	department to utilize an alternative reporting and payment
20	method, including applicable time requirements or any other
21	provision pursuant to Subsections E through H of this section,
22	if the audited partnership or tiered partner demonstrates that
23	the requested method will reasonably provide for the reporting
24	and payment of taxes, penalties and interest due pursuant to
25	Subsections E through H of this section. Application for
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<u>approval of an alternative reporting and payment method must be</u> <u>made by the audited partnership or tiered partner within the</u> <u>time for election as provided in Subsection G of this section</u>, as appropriate.

5 J. An election made pursuant to Subsection G or I 6 of this section is irrevocable, unless the department, in its 7 discretion, determines otherwise. If properly reported and 8 paid by the audited partnership or tiered partner, the amount 9 determined in Paragraph (2) of Subsection G of this section, or 10 similarly under an optional election pursuant to Subsection I 11 of this section, will be treated as paid in lieu of taxes owed 12 by its direct and indirect partners on the same final federal 13 adjustments. The direct or indirect partners of the 14 partnership that pays this in lieu of amount may not claim any 15 deduction, credit or refund with respect to that amount. 16 K. A taxpayer may make estimated payments of state 17 tax expected to result from a pending audit by the internal 18 revenue service prior to the final determination date, 19 following the process prescribed by the department, and such

payments will limit the accrual of further statutory interest on that amount.

L. A taxpayer may claim an amount of state tax resulting from final net-negative federal adjustments as provided in Section 7-1-26 NMSA 1978.

15	remain to be finally determined, whether by a decision of the
16	internal revenue service with respect to which all rights of
17	appeal have been waived or exhausted, by agreement, or, if
18	appealed or contested, by a final decision with respect to
19	which all rights of appeal have been waived or exhausted. For

17	A. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no
18	assessment of tax may be made by the department after three
19	years from the end of the calendar year in which payment of the
20	tax was due, and no proceeding in court for the collection of
21	such tax without the prior assessment thereof shall be begun
22	after the expiration of such period.
23	B. In case of a false or fraudulent return made by
24	a taxpayer with intent to evade tax, the amount thereof may be
25	assessed at any time within ten years from the end of the
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calendar year in which the tax was due, and no proceeding in court for the collection of such tax without the prior assessment thereof shall be begun after the expiration of such period.

C. In case of the failure by a taxpayer to complete and file any required return, the tax relating to the period for which the return was required may be assessed at any time within seven years from the end of the calendar year in which the tax was due, and no proceeding in court for the collection of such tax without the prior assessment thereof shall be begun after the expiration of such period.

D. If a taxpayer in a return understates by more than twenty-five percent the amount of liability for any tax for the period to which the return relates, appropriate assessments may be made by the department at any time within six years from the end of the calendar year in which payment of the tax was due.

E. If any adjustment in the basis for computation of any federal tax is made as a result of an audit by the internal revenue service or the filing of an amended federal return <u>or administrative adjustment request</u> changing a prior election or making any other change for which federal approval is required by the Internal Revenue Code that results in liability for any tax, the amount thereof may be assessed at any time, but not after three years from the end of the .219005.3 - 15 -

25	only until a date one year after the later of the date of the

(4) in the case of a payment of an amount of tax not made within three years of the end of the calendar year in which the original due date of the tax or date of the assessment of the department occurred, only for a claim for refund of that amount of tax and only within one year of the date on which the tax was paid; or

(5) in the case of a taxpayer who has been assessed a tax on or after July 1, 1993 [under] pursuant to Subsection B, C or D of Section 7-1-18 NMSA 1978 and an assessment that applies to a period ending at least three years prior to the beginning of the year in which the assessment was made, only for a refund for the same tax for the period of the assessment or for any period following that period within one year of the date of the assessment unless a longer period for claiming a refund is provided in this section.

G. No credit or refund shall be allowed or made to a person claiming a refund of gasoline tax [under] pursuant to Section 7-13-11 NMSA 1978 unless notice of the destruction of the gasoline was given to the department within thirty days of the actual destruction and the claim for refund is made within six months of the date of destruction. No credit or refund .219005.3

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shall be allowed or made to a person claiming a refund of gasoline tax [under] <u>pursuant to</u> Section 7-13-17 NMSA 1978 unless the refund is claimed within six months of the date of purchase of the gasoline and the gasoline has been used at the time the claim for refund is made.

H. If, as a result of an audit by the department or a managed audit covering multiple periods, an overpayment of tax is found in any period under the audit and if the taxpayer files a claim for refund for the overpayments identified in the audit, that overpayment may be credited against an underpayment of the same tax found in another period under audit pursuant to Section 7-1-29 NMSA 1978.

I. A refund of tax paid under any tax or tax act administered [under] <u>pursuant to</u> Subsection B of Section 7-1-2 NMSA 1978 may be made, at the discretion of the department, in the form of credit against future tax payments if future tax liabilities in an amount at least equal to the credit amount reasonably may be expected to become due.

J. For the purposes of this section, "oil and gas tax return" means a return reporting tax due with respect to oil, natural gas, liquid hydrocarbons, carbon dioxide, helium or nonhydrocarbon gas pursuant to the Oil and Gas Severance Tax Act, the Oil and Gas Conservation Tax Act, the Oil and Gas Emergency School Tax Act, the Oil and Gas Ad Valorem Production Tax Act, the Natural Gas Processors Tax Act or the Oil and Gas .219005.3

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Production Equipment Ad Valorem Tax Act.

Κ. The filing of a fully completed original income 3 tax return, corporate income tax return, corporate income and franchise tax return, estate tax return or special fuel excise tax return that shows a balance due the taxpayer or a fully completed amended income tax return, an amended corporate 7 income tax return, an amended corporate income and franchise 8 tax return, an amended estate tax return, an amended special fuel excise tax return or an amended oil and gas tax return 10 that shows a lesser tax liability than the original return 11 constitutes the filing of a claim for refund for the difference 12 in tax due shown on the original and amended returns.

L. In no case may a credit or refund be claimed if the related federal adjustment is taken into account by a partnership in the partnership's tax return for the adjustment year and allocated to the partners in a manner similar to other partnership tax items."

SECTION 4. Section 7-1-29 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1965, Chapter 248, Section 31, as amended) is amended to read:

"7-1-29. AUTHORITY TO MAKE REFUNDS OR CREDITS.--

In response to a claim for refund, credit or Α. rebate made as provided in Section 7-1-26 NMSA 1978, but before a court acquires jurisdiction of the matter, the secretary or the secretary's delegate may authorize payment to a person in the amount of the credit or rebate claimed or refund an .219005.3

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1 overpayment of tax determined by the secretary or the 2 secretary's delegate to have been erroneously made by the 3 person, together with allowable interest. A payment of a 4 credit rebate claimed or a refund of tax and interest 5 erroneously paid amounting to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) or more shall be made with the prior approval of the attorney 6 7 general, except that the secretary or the secretary's delegate 8 may make refunds with respect to the Oil and Gas Severance Tax 9 Act, the Oil and Gas Conservation Tax Act, the Oil and Gas 10 Emergency School Tax Act, the Oil and Gas Ad Valorem Production 11 Tax Act, the Natural Gas Processors Tax Act or the Oil and Gas 12 Production Equipment Ad Valorem Tax Act, Section 7-13-17 NMSA 13 1978 and the Cigarette Tax Act without the prior approval of 14 the attorney general regardless of the amount.

B. Pursuant to the final order of the district court, the court of appeals, the supreme court of New Mexico or a federal court, from which order, appeal or review is not successfully taken, adjudging that a person has properly claimed a credit, [or] rebate or [made an overpayment of] <u>a</u> <u>refund of overpaid</u> tax, the secretary shall authorize the payment to the person of the amount thereof. <u>After a court</u> <u>acquires jurisdiction but before it issues a final order, the</u> <u>secretary may authorize payment of a credit, rebate or refund</u> <u>pursuant to a closing agreement pursuant to Section 7-1-20 NMSA</u> <u>1978.</u>

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C. In the discretion of the secretary, any amount of credit or rebate to be paid or tax to be refunded may be offset against any amount of tax for which the person due to receive the credit, rebate payment or refund is liable. The secretary or the secretary's delegate shall give notice to the taxpayer that the credit, rebate payment or refund will be made in this manner, and the taxpayer shall be entitled to interest pursuant to Section 7-1-68 NMSA 1978 until the tax liability is credited with the credit, rebate or refund amount.

In an audit by the department or a managed audit D. covering multiple reporting periods in which both underpayments and overpayments of a tax have been made in different reporting periods, the department shall credit the tax overpayments against the underpayments; provided that the taxpayer files a claim for refund of the overpayments. An overpayment shall be applied as a credit first to the earliest underpayment and then to succeeding underpayments. An underpayment of tax to which an overpayment is credited pursuant to this section shall be deemed paid in the period in which the overpayment was made or the period to which the overpayment was credited against an underpayment, whichever is later. If the overpayments credited pursuant to this section exceed the underpayments of a tax, the amount of the net overpayment for the periods covered in the audit shall be refunded to the taxpayer.

E. When a taxpayer makes a payment identified to a .219005.3

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particular return or assessment, and the department determines that the payment exceeds the amount due pursuant to that return or assessment, the secretary may apply the excess to the taxpayer's other liabilities pursuant to the tax acts to which the return or assessment applies, without requiring the taxpayer to file a claim for a refund. The liability to which an overpayment is applied pursuant to this section shall be deemed paid in the period in which the overpayment was made or the period to which the overpayment was applied, whichever is later.

F. If the department determines, upon review of an original or amended income tax return, corporate income and franchise tax return, estate tax return, special fuels excise tax return or oil and gas tax return, that there has been an overpayment of tax for the taxable period to which the return or amended return relates in excess of the amount due to be refunded to the taxpayer pursuant to the provisions of Subsection K of Section 7-1-26 NMSA 1978, the department may refund that excess amount to the taxpayer without requiring the taxpayer to file a refund claim.

G. Records of refunds and credits made in excess of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) shall be available for inspection by the public. The department shall keep such records for a minimum of three years from the date of the refund or credit.

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1 н. In response to a timely refund claim pursuant to 2 Section 7-1-26 NMSA 1978 and notwithstanding any other 3 provision of the Tax Administration Act, the secretary or the 4 secretary's delegate may refund or credit a portion of an 5 assessment of tax paid, including applicable penalties and 6 interest representing the amount of tax previously paid by 7 another person on behalf of the taxpayer on the same 8 transaction; provided that the requirements of equitable 9 recoupment are met. For purposes of this subsection, the 10 refund claim may be filed by the taxpayer to whom the 11 assessment was issued or by another person who claims to have 12 previously paid the tax on behalf of the taxpayer. Prior to 13 granting the refund or credit, the secretary may require a 14 waiver of all rights to claim a refund or credit of the tax 15 previously paid by another person paying a tax on behalf of the 16 taxpayer.

17 If, as a result of an audit by the department or I. 18 a managed audit, a person is determined to owe gross receipts 19 tax on receipts from the sale of property or services, the 20 department may credit against the amount owed an amount of 21 compensating tax paid by the purchaser if the person can 22 demonstrate that the purchaser timely paid the compensating tax 23 on the same property or services. The credit provided by this 24 subsection shall not be denied solely because the purchaser 25 cannot timely file for a refund of the compensating tax paid .219005.3

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and, if the credit is to be granted, the department shall require, for the purpose of granting the credit, that the purchaser give up any right to claim a refund of that tax."

SECTION 5. A new section of the Withholding Tax Act is enacted to read:

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"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] COMPOSITE RETURNS.--

A pass-through entity may file a composite Α. 8 income tax return on behalf of electing nonresident members reporting and paying income tax at the highest marginal rate provided in Section 7-2A-5 NMSA 1978 on the members' pro rata or distributive shares of income of the pass-through entity 12 from doing business in, or deriving income from sources within, this state.

A nonresident member whose only source of income Β. within a state is from one or more pass-through entities may elect to be included in a composite income tax return filed pursuant to this section.

C. A nonresident member that has been included in a composite income tax return may file an individual income tax return and shall receive credit for tax paid on the member's behalf by the pass-through entity.

"pass-through entity" means a corporation (1)that for the applicable tax year is treated as an S corporation pursuant to Section 1362(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and .219005.3 - 29 -

= delete underscored material = new bracketed material] any entity with one or more members that is not taxed as a corporation pursuant to Subchapter C of the Internal Revenue Code:

(2) "member" means a shareholder of an S corporation; a partner in a general partnership, a limited partnership or a limited liability partnership; a member of a 7 limited liability company; or a beneficiary of a trust; and

"nonresident" means an individual who is 8 (3) 9 not a resident of or domiciled in the state, a business entity 10 that does not have its commercial domicile in the state or a 11 trust not organized in the state."

SECTION 6. APPLICABILITY.--The provisions of Sections 1 and 5 of this act apply to federal adjustments with a final determination date occurring on and after January 1, 2021.

EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the SECTION 7. provisions of this act is July 1, 2021.

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
