12	EMPLOYEES; PROVIDING AN ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT TO THE MINIMUM WAGES

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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 50-4-22 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1955,
17	Chapter 200, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"50-4-22. MINIMUM WAGES
19	A. Except as provided in [ <del>Subsection</del> ] <u>Subsections</u> C
20	and $\underline{E}$ of this section, an employer shall pay to an employee a
21	minimum wage rate of:
22	(l) prior to [ <del>January l, 2020, at least seven</del>
23	dollars fifty cents (\$7.50) an hour;
24	(2) beginning January 1, 2020 and prior to
25	January 1, 2021, at least nine dollars (\$9.00) an hour;
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1	(3) beginning January 1, 2021 and prior to
2	January 1, 2022, at least ten dollars fifty cents (\$10.50) an
3	<del>hour;</del>
4	(4) beginning January 1, 2022 and prior to]
5	January 1, 2023, at least eleven dollars fifty cents (\$11.50)
6	an hour; [ <del>and</del>
7	(5) on and after] (2) beginning January 1,
8	2023, at least twelve dollars (\$12.00) an hour;
9	(3) beginning January 1, 2024, at least
10	sixteen dollars (\$16.00) an hour; and
11	(4) on and after January 1, 2025, sixteen
12	dollars (\$16.00) an hour adjusted annually pursuant to the
13	provisions of Subsection E of this section.
14	B. An employer furnishing food, utilities, supplies
15	or housing to an employee who is engaged in agriculture may
16	deduct the reasonable value of such furnished items from any
17	wages due to the employee.
18	C. An employee who customarily and regularly
19	receives more than thirty dollars (\$30.00) a month in tips
20	shall be paid a minimum hourly wage as follows:
21	(1) prior to January 1, 2020, at least two
22	dollars thirteen cents (\$2.13) an hour;
23	(2) beginning January 1, 2020 and prior to
24	January 1, 2021, at least two dollars thirty-five cents (\$2.35)
25	an hour;
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1 beginning January 1, 2021 and prior to (3) January 1, 2022, at least two dollars fifty-five cents (\$2.55) 2 3 an hour; 4 beginning January 1, 2022 and prior to (4) 5 January 1, 2023, at least two dollars eighty cents (\$2.80) an 6 hour; 7 (5) on and after January 1, 2023, at least 8 three dollars (\$3.00) an hour <u>adjusted pursuant to the</u> 9 provisions of Subsection E of this section; and 10 the employer may consider tips as part of (6) 11 wages, but the tips combined with the employer's cash wage 12 shall not equal less than the minimum wage rate as provided in 13 Subsection A of this section. All tips received by such 14 employees shall be retained by the employee, except that 15 nothing in this section shall prohibit the pooling of tips 16 among wait staff. 17 An employee shall not be required to work more D. 18 than forty hours in any week of seven days, unless the employee 19 is paid one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly 20 rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours. For 21 an employee who is paid a fixed salary for fluctuating hours 22 and who is employed by an employer a majority of whose business 23 in New Mexico consists of providing investigative services to

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the federal government, the hourly rate may be calculated in

1	Standards Act of 1938 and the regulations pursuant to that act;
2	provided that in no case shall the hourly rate be less than the
3	federal minimum wage.
4	E. On January 1, 2025 and on January 1 of each
5	successive year, the minimum wage rate provided by Paragraph
6	(4) of Subsection A and Paragraph (5) of Subsection C of this
7	section shall be increased by the percentage increase during
8	the previous year of the consumer price index for all urban
9	consumers, United States city average for all items, or its
10	successor index, as published by the United States department
11	of labor or its successor agency; provided that the minimum
12	wage rate shall not be adjusted downward as a result of a
13	decrease in the consumer price index. By November 1, 2024 and
14	by November 1 of each successive year, the workforce solutions
15	department shall post on its website and otherwise notify
16	employers of the minimum wage for the next year."
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
