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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:	
8	SECTION 1. A new section of the New Mexico Finance	
9	Authority Act is enacted to read:	
10	"LOCAL SOLAR ACCESS FUNDCREATEDAPPLICATIONS AND	
11	GRANTSCONTRACT PERFORMANCE AND PAYMENT BONDS	
12	A. As used in this section:	
13	(1) "eligible entity" means a county, a	
14	municipality, a school district, a land grant-merced	
15	controlled and governed pursuant to Chapter 49, Article 1	
16	NMSA 1978 or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located wholly	
17	or partially in New Mexico; and	
18	(2) "solar energy system" means the	
19	equipment used to generate, convert, store, manage and	
20	monitor solar energy for use as thermal energy or electricity	
21	and may include:	
22	(a) energy storage systems, including	
23	batteries, that are capable of retaining, storing and	
24	delivering electrical energy by chemical, thermal, mechanical	
25	or other means; and	HB 128/a Page l

(b) interconnection equipment required to safely interconnect the system with the electrical grid.

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The "local solar access fund" is created in the 3 Β. 4 authority. The fund consists of appropriations, 5 distributions, transfers, income from investment of the fund, 6 bequests, gifts, grants, donations and any other money distributed or otherwise allocated to the fund. Balances in 7 8 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the 9 general fund. The fund shall be administered by the 10 authority as a separate account and may consist of subaccounts as the authority deems necessary to carry out the 11 purposes of the fund. 12

C. Money in the fund is appropriated to the
authority to implement the provisions of this section,
including to:

(1) provide grants to eligible entities to
plan, design, construct, purchase, install and equip solar
energy systems used to power buildings and infrastructure
located within New Mexico that are owned and operated by an
eligible entity, including necessary upgrades or repairs
required to install or connect solar energy systems;

(2) provide grants to eligible entities or
New Mexico councils of governments for technical assistance
to apply for federal or other funding to plan, design,
construct, purchase, install and equip solar energy systems;

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1 and 2 pay the administrative costs incurred by (3) 3 the authority in carrying out the provisions of this section. 4 Money in the fund that is not needed for D. 5 immediate disbursement may be deposited or invested in the 6 same manner as other funds administered by the authority. By December 31, 2025, the authority shall 7 Ε. establish rules in consultation with the energy, minerals and 8 natural resources department to carry out the provisions of 9 10 this section, including: criteria for evaluating proposed solar 11 (1)energy systems, including minimum eligibility requirements; 12 and 13 metrics to be used by the authority to (2) 14 15 prioritize solar energy systems that shall include: an eligible entity's need for 16 (a) authority funding to plan or complete a solar energy system; 17 (b) the percentage of low-income 18 households in the community served by that solar energy 19 20 system; buildings and infrastructure that (c) 21 are used to provide community services or emergency shelter; 22 (d) the requirement that the majority 23 of the funding shall be allocated to rural eligible entities 24 as determined by the authority; 25

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1 the projected long-term operating (e) 2 cost reductions of the solar energy system; 3 (f) procedures to ensure maximum geographic disbursement and diversity; 4 5 (g) appropriate caps on different types 6 of grants to ensure the fund's sustainability and selection of the most qualified projects; 7 8 (h) solar energy systems that include an energy storage system; 9 10 (i) pricing consistent with statewide price agreements; and 11 solar energy systems that support 12 (j) workforce development, including by hiring local New Mexico 13 workers, paying the prevailing wage or hiring workers 14 15 participating in apprenticeship programs that are registered pursuant to the Apprenticeship Assistance Act. 16 F. Applications for grants shall be in a form 17 specified by the authority and shall include such information 18 as required by the authority, including: 19 20 (1) an estimate of the cost of the solar energy system for which a grant is being sought; 21 (2) an estimate of the operating cost 22 savings expected to be achieved by the solar energy system; 23 and 24 (3) a description of the benefits of the 25

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solar energy system.

2	G. An eligible entity, except for an Indian	
3	nation, tribe or pueblo, that is made a grant pursuant to this	
4	section shall require a contractor of a project funded by the	
5	local solar access fund to post a performance and payment bond	
6	as described in Section 13-4-18 NMSA 1978."	HB 128/a
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
