1 AN ACT 2 RELATING TO LOBBYING; REQUIRING A LOBBYING ACTIVITY REPORT ON 3 THE LEGISLATION LOBBIED AND POSITION TAKEN BY A LOBBYIST AND 4 LOBBYIST'S EMPLOYER; PRESERVING LOBBYING ACTIVITY REPORTS FOR 5 AT LEAST TEN YEARS. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 7 8 SECTION 1. A new section of the Lobbyist Regulation Act is enacted to read: 9 10 "LOBBYING ACTIVITY REPORT .--A lobbyist or lobbyist's employer that is 11 Α. required to file an expenditure report pursuant to Section 12 2-11-6 NMSA 1978 or registration statement pursuant to 13 Section 2-11-3 NMSA 1978 shall file a lobbying activity 14 15 report or reports with the secretary of state that discloses the lobbyist's or lobbyist's employer's lobbying activity on 16 legislation that has been introduced, including any lobbying 17 on the development of legislation prior to its introduction 18 in a legislative session, and that identifies the: 19 20 (1) specific legislation lobbied; (2) lobbyist's and lobbyist's employer's 21 support, opposition or other position taken on the 22 legislation and whether the support, opposition or other 23 position changed; and 24 25 (3) name of the lobbyist's employer that

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 registered lobbyist.

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B. If a lobbyist or lobbyist's employer commences lobbying on legislation after the adjournment of a legislative session, a lobbying activity report shall be filed prior to the end of the time period in which the governor may act on legislation.

8 C. A lobbyist or lobbyist's employer is only
9 required to report lobbying activity on a piece of
10 legislation one time unless the lobbyist's or lobbyist's
11 employer's position on the legislation has changed, in which
12 case the lobbying activity for each change in position shall
13 be reported.

D. The lobbying activity report shall be filed in a format as prescribed by rule of the secretary of state within forty-eight hours of commencement of the lobbying activity.

E. The lobbying activity reported for each specific piece of legislation shall be included or linked on the legislature's website for that specific piece of legislation."

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A. Each registration, expenditure and lobbying activity report as required by the Lobbyist Regulation Act shall be archived and accessible on the secretary of state's lobbyist disclosure website for a period of at least ten years from the date of filing as a public record, open to public inspection at any reasonable time. Unless an action or prosecution is pending that requires preserving the report, it may be destroyed ten years after the date of filing.

B. Lobbyist registration, expenditure and lobbying activity reports shall be kept and maintained on the secretary of state's lobbyist disclosure website and shall be available in searchable and downloadable formats.

15 C. With respect to the secretary of state's 16 lobbyist disclosure website, all items in the records shall 17 be easily searchable, sortable and downloadable by the public 18 to the extent technically practicable.

The secretary of state shall ensure that D. 19 20 contributions reported by persons pursuant to the Lobbyist Regulation Act are reported in a manner that is 21 nonduplicative and as consistent as practicable with the 22 reporting requirements of the Campaign Reporting Act. To the 23 extent possible, the electronic reporting system used for 24 25 registration and reporting required by the Lobbyist HB 143/a

4	E. Reporting individuals under the Campaign	
5	Reporting Act shall receive automatic electronic notice of	
6	the contributions to them reported by lobbyists and	
7	lobbyists' employers within twenty-four hours of the filing	
8	of each expenditure report."	
9	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
