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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:	
8	SECTION 1. Section 22-8-18 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1974,	
9	Chapter 8, Section 8, as amended) is amended to read:	
10	"22-8-18. PROGRAM COST CALCULATIONLOCAL	
11	RESPONSIBILITY	
12	A. The total program units for the purpose of	
13	computing the program cost shall be calculated by multiplying	
14	the sum of the program units itemized as Paragraphs (1) and	
15	(2) in this subsection by the staffing cost multiplier and	
16	adding the program units itemized as Paragraphs (3) through	
17	(16) in this subsection. The itemized program units are as	
18	follows:	
19	(1) early childhood education;	
20	(2) basic education;	
21	(3) special education, adjusted by	
22	subtracting the units derived from membership in class D	
23	special education programs in private, nonsectarian,	
24	nonprofit training centers;

1 (5) fine arts education; 2 (6) elementary physical education; 3 (7) size adjustment; 4 (8) at-risk; 5 (9) enrollment growth or new district 6 adjustment; (10) special education units derived from 7 8 membership in class D special education programs in private, 9 nonsectarian, nonprofit training centers; 10 (11) national board for professional teaching standards certification; 11 (12)home school student; 12 home school student activities; 13 (13) (14) charter school student activities; 14 15 (15) K-12 plus; and (16) national board for certification of 16 school nurses certification. 17 The total program cost calculated as prescribed Β. 18 in Subsection A of this section includes the cost of early 19 20 childhood, special, bilingual multicultural, fine arts and vocational education and other remedial or enrichment 21 It is the responsibility of the local school board 22 programs. or governing body of a charter school to determine its 23 priorities in terms of the needs of the community served by 24 25 that board. Except as otherwise provided in this section,

funds generated under the Public School Finance Act are discretionary to local school boards and governing bodies of charter schools; provided that the special program needs as enumerated in this section are met; and provided further that the department shall ensure that the local school board or governing body of a charter school is prioritizing resources for the public school toward proven programs and methods linked to improved student achievement."

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9 SECTION 2. A new section of the Public School Finance
10 Act is enacted to read:

"SCHOOL NURSES--CERTIFICATION BY NATIONAL BOARD FOR 11 CERTIFICATION OF SCHOOL NURSES--PROGRAM UNITS.--The number of 12 program units for licensed level two or level three school 13 nurses who are registered nurses and who are certified by the 14 15 national board for certification of school nurses is determined by multiplying by one and one-half the number of 16 licensed school employees certified by the national board for 17 certification of school nurses employed by the school 18 district or charter school on or before the first reporting 19 20 date of the school year and verified by the department. Department approval of these units shall be contingent on 21 verification by the school district or charter school that 22 these licensed school nurses hold certification by the 23 national board for certification of school nurses and are 24 receiving a one-time salary differential equal to or greater 25

than the amount generated by the units multiplied by the program unit value during the fiscal year in which the school district or charter school will receive these units."

SECTION 3. A new section of the School Personnel Act is enacted to read:

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"SCHOOL NURSES--LEVEL ONE LICENSURE.--

7 Α. A level one license is a provisional three-year 8 license for beginning registered nurses who do not have at least three years of nursing experience satisfactory to the 9 10 department prior to being licensed as a school nurse and that requires as a condition of licensure that the licensee 11 undergo a formal mentorship program for at least one full 12 school year and an annual intensive performance evaluation by 13 a level three school nurse; provided that the department 14 15 shall promulgate rules for mentorship and evaluation when a school district does not have a level three nurse. 16 Α registered nurse with at least three years of nursing 17 experience satisfactory to the department is not required to 18 serve as a level one school nurse. 19

B. Each school district, in accordance with
department rules, shall provide for the mentorship and
evaluation of level one school nurses. At the end of each
year and at the end of the license period, the level one
school nurse shall be evaluated for competency. If the
school nurse fails to demonstrate satisfactory progress and

1 competence annually, the school nurse may be terminated as 2 provided in Section 22-10A-24 NMSA 1978. If the school nurse 3 has not demonstrated satisfactory progress and competence by 4 the end of the three-year period, the school nurse shall not 5 be granted a level two license. C. Except in exigent circumstances defined by 6 department rule, a level one license shall not be extended 7 8 beyond the initial period. 9 D. The department shall issue a standard level one 10 license to an applicant who is at least eighteen years of age who: 11 (1)holds an associate or baccalaureate 12 degree in nursing from an accredited educational institution; 13 (2) is licensed by the board of nursing as a 14 15 registered nurse; and 16 (3) meets other qualifications for level one licensure, including clearance of the required background 17 check. 18 Ε. The department shall establish competencies and 19 20 qualifications for level one licensure. F. The minimum salary for a level one school nurse 21 is the same as that for a level one teacher for a standard 22 nine and one-half month contract. 23 G. After the issuance of a license, a license 24 25 holder shall not be required to meet changed requirements to

maintain the license until such time as the license expires and the license holder seeks renewal of the license."

SECTION 4. A new section of the School Personnel Act is enacted to read:

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"SCHOOL NURSES--LEVEL TWO LICENSURE.--

A. A level two license is a nine-year license 6 granted to a school nurse who is a registered nurse who holds 7 a level one license or has at least three years of registered 8 nursing experience satisfactory to the department and who 9 10 meets the qualifications for level two licensure and who annually demonstrates essential competency to nurse. If a 11 level two school nurse does not demonstrate essential 12 competency in a given school year, the school district shall 13 provide the school nurse with additional professional 14 15 development and mentorship during the following school year. If by the end of that school year the school nurse fails to 16 demonstrate essential competency, a school district may 17 choose not to contract with the school nurse. 18

The department shall issue a level two license B. 20 to an applicant who has served successfully as a school nurse at level one or who has at least three years of registered 21 nursing experience or is granted reciprocity as provided by 22 department rules. An applicant for a level two license 23 shall: 24

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(1) demonstrate essential competency

1 required by the department as verified by the local 2 superintendent through a highly objective uniform statewide 3 standard of evaluation for school nurses; and 4 (2) meet other qualifications as required by 5 the department. С. The minimum salary for a level two school nurse 6 is the same as that for a level two teacher for a standard 7 nine and one-half month contract." 8 SECTION 5. A new section of the School Personnel Act is 9 10 enacted to read: "SCHOOL NURSES--LEVEL THREE LICENSURE.--11 A level three license is a nine-year license 12 Α. granted to a school nurse who meets the qualifications for 13 that level and who annually demonstrates nursing leadership 14 15 competencies. If a level three school nurse does not demonstrate essential nursing leadership competency in a 16 given school year, the school district shall provide the 17 school nurse with additional professional development and 18 mentorship during the following school year. If by the end 19 20 of that school year the school nurse fails to demonstrate essential nursing leadership competency, a school district 21 may choose not to contract with the school nurse. 22 The department shall grant a level three Β. 23 license to an applicant who: 24 has been a level two school nurse for at (1)25 HB 195/a Page 7
