8	SECTION 1. Section 29-15-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,	
9	Chapter 146, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:	
10	"29-15-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Missing Persons	
11	Information and Reporting Act:	
12	A. "Brittany alert" means a notification relating	
13	to an endangered person:	
14	(1) who is a missing person; and	
15	(2) about whom there is a clear indication	
16	that the person has a developmental disability as defined in	
17	Subsection A of Section 28-16A-6 NMSA 1978 and that the	
18	person's health or safety is at risk;	
19	B. "child" means a person under the age of	
20	eighteen years who is not emancipated;	
21	C. "clearinghouse" means the missing persons

23	D. "custodian" means a parent, guardian or other

"lead station" means an AM radio station that 2 has been designated as the "state primary station" by the 3 federal communications commission for the emergency alert 4 system; 5 I. "missing person" means a person whose 6 whereabouts are unknown to the person's custodian or immediate family member and the circumstances of whose 7 8 absence indicate that: the person did not leave the care and 9 (1) 10 control of the custodian or immediate family member voluntarily and the taking of the person was not authorized 11 by law; or 12 (2) the person voluntarily left the care and 13 control of the custodian without the custodian's consent and 14 15 without intent to return; "missing person report" means information that 16 J. is: 17 (1) given to a law enforcement agency on 18 a form used for sending information to the national crime 19 20 information center; and (2) about a person whose whereabouts are 21 unknown to the reporter and who is alleged in the form 22 submitted by the reporter to be missing; 23 "person" means an individual, regardless of 24 Κ. 25 age;

"possible match" means the similarities between 2 unidentified human remains and a missing person that would 3 lead one to believe they are the same person; "reporter" means the person who reports a 4 Μ. 5 missing person; "silver alert" means a notification relating to 6 N. 7 an endangered person: 8 (1) who is a missing person; and (2) who is fifty years or older; or 9 10 (3) about whom there is a clear indication that the individual suffers from Alzheimer's disease or 11 another form of dementia, regardless of age; 12 0. "state agency" means an agency of the state, a 13 political subdivision of the state or a public post-secondary 14 15 educational institution; "state registrar" means the employee so 16 Ρ. designated by the public health division of the department 17 of health pursuant to the Vital Statistics Act; and 18 Q. "turquoise alert" means a notification relating 19 20 to a missing person who is an enrolled member or a person eligible for enrollment in a federally or state-recognized 21 Indian nation, tribe or pueblo and the person: 22 is missing due to involuntary, (1)23 unexplained or suspicious circumstances; 24 is at risk due to safety or health 25 (2) SB 41 Page 4 concerns; or

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(3) suffers from a mental or physical disability or substance abuse disorder."

SECTION 2. A new section of the Missing Persons Information and Reporting Act, Section 29-15-3.5 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

"29-15-3.5. TURQUOISE ALERT ADVISORY.--

A. The department of public safety or the lead investigating law enforcement agency shall issue a turquoise alert if, after review and investigation of a missing person report of a person subject to the alert, the department of public safety or the lead investigating law enforcement agency makes an independent determination that the missing person is a person subject to the alert.

B. The department of public safety shall develop and implement a turquoise alert plan for the purpose of disseminating, as rapidly as possible, information about a person subject to the alert. The plan shall:

(1) provide a procedure for the department to notify the lead station that a turquoise alert has been declared. The procedure shall include codes for use by the department in communicating with the lead station to prevent false alerts;

24 (2) provide a procedure in which other state25 and private print, radio, television or other media may alert SB 41

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members of the public of the missing person;

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(3) include a procedure for notifying the department of information technology that a turquoise alert has been declared. The department of information technology shall immediately transmit the notification and related information to all state field operations employees so that they may be aware and vigilant in the course of their regular activities;

require cellular service companies to 9 (4) 10 implement turquoise alerts in accordance with the federal communications commission's wireless emergency alerts 11 The alert from cellular service companies shall 12 processes. only be required after a determination by the department of 13 public safety or the lead investigating law enforcement 14 15 agency that there is evidence of imminent danger of serious 16 bodily harm to or death of the missing person and that there is enough descriptive information about the missing person to 17 assist in locating that person; 18

19 (5) include a procedure for notifying all
20 local and federal law enforcement agencies that a turquoise
21 alert has been declared;

(6) provide for dissemination of information about the missing person to the lead station, the department of information technology and local law enforcement agencies when a turquoise alert has been declared; and

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1	(7) provide for collecting and maintaining	
2	the following records regarding each turquoise alert issued:	
3	(a) the municipality where the missing	
4	person report originated;	
5	(b) the age of the missing person;	
6	(c) the gender of the missing person;	
7	(d) the date of the missing person	
8	report;	
9	(e) the date the turquoise alert is	
10	issued; and	
11	(f) the date of recovery of the missing	
12	person.	
13	C. The department of public safety shall	
14	distribute the turquoise alert notification plan to all local	
15	law enforcement agencies and provide such training and other	
16	assistance as is necessary to ensure that the plan can be	
17	properly implemented.	
18	D. Once a turquoise alert has been declared, only	
19	the department of public safety or the lead investigating law	
20	enforcement agency may terminate the turquoise alert." SB 41	
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
